## **Staff News**

We are very sad that Nurse Sophie West will be leaving the surgery in the New Year to join the Community Diabetes Team. Sophie has been a huge asset to the team and is moving on to concentrate on helping patients with more complex Diabetes.

Advanced Nurse Practitioner **Zoe Corbett** will be taking over the management and support of Diabetic patients registered with the surgery. Until Sophie leaves, Zoe will be sitting in and observing Sophie's clinics with a view to getting to know this group of patients. Zoe will continue some of the minor illness work that she has been doing at the surgery.

## **Armed Forces Veteran friendly accredited GP practice**

We are now an Armed Forces Veteran friendly accredited GP practice.

This means that, as part of the health commitments of the Armed Forces Covenant, we have a dedicated clinician, Alan Collett, who has a specialist knowledge of military related health conditions and veteran specific health services. This is important in helping ex-forces personnel to get the best care and treatment.

A veteran is anyone who has served for at least one day in the Armed Forces, whether regular or reserve. It means the same as 'ex-service personnel' or 'ex-forces', although not all veterans know, choose or want to associate with the term 'veteran'. This is particularly the case amongst younger veterans who often refer to themselves as 'ex-forces', due to the common belief that a veteran is someone who fought in the First / Second World War.

# Firearms / Shotgun Application / Renewals

Please note that we no longer complete medical application/renewal forms for shotgun / firearms licences. GPs are not contracted to provide this service and unfortunately the new requirements to check a patient's entire medical records are unfeasible for a GP to complete. Patients should therefore contact the relevant Firearms Licensing Team who can direct them to a private provider. The private provider will contact the surgery regarding release of the patient's medical records. This will be dealt with by an administrator in the practice (saving the GP's time) and the provider will then process the application on their behalf.

## **NHS App and Online Access**

An NHS account allows patients to access services through the NHS App or website. By signing up patients can have access to:-

- Order repeat prescriptions
- Book appointments
- View their health record including test results
- View and download the NHS Covid Pass

## **Home Blood pressure monitors**

We make no apology for repeating this important item which appeared on page 7 of our last issue.

Whilst the surgery have monitors for patients to borrow short term, the general advice is that it is sensible for all households to own one.

Costing around £20 they are generally available online or from pharmacies or large supermarkets.

As a general guide:

normal blood pressure is considered to be between 90/60mmHg and 120/80mmHg high blood pressure is considered to be 140/90mmHg or higher low blood pressure is considered to be 90/60mmHg or lower

If you are worried about your blood pressure, go to the surgery and check it on the Pod, or if aged 40-74 with no other long-term conditions, book a free NHS Health Check.

#### **Surgery Feedback**

The surgery has recommenced sending out text messages for feedback (good and not so good) following appointments. All feedback is read and themes are shared with the whole staff team.

Suggestions for improvement are considered by the management team and where possible steps are taken to rectify issues.

One area of improvement that we are looking at, following feedback, is the appointment confirmation text message wording which reads "This appointment will be by telephone unless you have been advised otherwise". There will be changes to this in the coming weeks.

# **Kate's Home Nursing**

For those of you who do not know about Kate's, it is a palliative care charity which looks after patients requiring end of life care and who would like to die at home. It is a small charity, which for 25 years has worked in our area.

Over the years the charity has developed a team of nursing staff and procedures for the delivery of care to those who need it. It has 22 registered nurses who provide over 6400 hours of nursing care annually. That means they care for over 150 patients in a year. Together with the support they

provide to families, their carers and through their bereavement cafes and bereavement services it is estimated they actually help over 600 people a year.

They have an active bereavement service, that consists of: a bereavement café, 10am til noon on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of every month. This is held at the cricket club in Bourton-on-the-Water. They also organise bereavement walks, bereavement support visits and telephone calls at strategic poignant moments for loved ones. If further support is needed, a counselling service is also available.

They also have a carers' café which is held on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of each month, 1-3pm at the George Moore Community Centre, Bourton-on-the-Water. At present this is a new venture for them. They would really like to support more carers, so, if you are a carer please drop in for a cuppa and chat with one of their team. Some carers attend with their loved one who they are caring for while others choose to go alone or bring a friend. People have highly rated the support they gain from attending the carers' café.
