Donations

Appointment System Review

In the last newsletter we mentioned a review of the appointment system. At the time of writing, we have implemented some changes which are being trialled.

• All routine GP appointments are now being offered in person / face to face. If you would prefer to consult with the clinician over the telephone that is fine; just let us know.

Since the pandemic we have operated an "on the day" appointment system for anyone who felt they needed to be seen (or spoken to) by a clinician the same day. Unfortunately, the number of contacts became unmanageable.

The British Medical Association guidelines are that for a GP to deliver safe care they should not have more than 25 contacts per day.

• Moving forwards, we will be trialling a restricted number of contacts for the clinicians on the duty team to 30 contacts each per day.

This is still more appointments than recommended but is in line with anticipated demand for urgent requests and more manageable than the previous uncapped system.

If the demand for urgent appointments exceeds capacity, then patients will be directed to an appropriate service. This might be to a local community pharmacy, a minor injury / illness unit or to NHS111.

- Alan Collett, our Advanced Clinical Practitioner is trialling some in person, minor illness appointments which can be booked without triage.
- More planned / routine appointments are being made available to support patients with non-urgent problems
- We have trained our Clinical Administrators to enable them to direct patients to the most appropriate service / clinician
- Dr Tom Jenkins has increased the number of musculoskeletal appointments available to patients registered with the GP practices across the North Cotswolds. This means that in addition to his clinic in Stow on Wednesday mornings patients may also be offered appointments in other locations on Tuesday / Wednesday afternoons.
- We are trialling a service where patients can be sent text messages with a link to book into appointment types (like the Covid vaccination invitations)

Cloud Based Telephone System

There has been widespread coverage in the media recently about cloud-based telephone systems for GPs surgeries and their ability to reduce the 8.00am rush.

We don't have a cloud-based system at Stow Surgery. This will therefore be a priority for us in the coming year. In addition to allowing patients to leave their place in the queue and receive a call back, such a new system will also allow us to record calls (for training and complaint response purposes) and provide better management of call waiting.

Meanwhile we have improved accessibility by phone and are very pleased with patient feedback The results from the 2022 patient survey revealed that: -

• 90% of the patients surveyed felt that it was easy to get through to someone at Stow Surgery on the phone. The Gloucestershire wide result was 69% and nationally only 53% found it easy to get through to their practice.

• 81% of the patients surveyed described their experience of making an appointment at Stow Surgery as good or excellent. The North Cotswolds average was 70%, Gloucestershire wide 66% and nationally only 56% described their experience as good or excellent.

Covid Spring Boosters

If you are eligible and have not yet received your spring booster then contact the Covid Hub (tel:01608 692115) currently open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am to 2pm.

Repeat Dispensing / Batch Prescriptions

If you get regular or repeat prescriptions from a pharmacy (<u>not</u> the surgery dispensary), you could save time by switching to electronic Repeat Dispensing (eRD) or batch prescriptions as they are frequently referred to.

eRD sends your prescriptions electronically from your GP surgery to the pharmacy of your choice. eRD allows your GP to prescribe your regular medicines for up to a year.

Your regular prescriptions are stored securely on the NHS database, so they'll be ready at the pharmacy each time you need them.

Using eRD you can:

• save time by avoiding unnecessary trips or calls to your GP every time you need to order a repeat prescription

• pick up your repeat prescriptions directly from your pharmacy without having to visit your GP

• spend less time waiting for your prescription in the pharmacy or GP practice

Dispensary Delivery Service

Patients who obtain their medicines from the surgery dispensary have benefitted from a delivery service which was started during the pandemic and supported by FOSS. Deliveries are predominantly made to patients who are housebound or who struggle to get to the surgery to
